## Sea Point cops nab house robbers

Two suspects, who may be linked to various house break-ins, have been arrested in Sea Point.

Sea Point police spokesperson Captain Elizabeth Munro has confirmed that two men were arrested after local police received a notification of a vehicle, which had been linked to house break-ins in the area, entering the precinct on Thursday 4 October.

Police officers responded to the incident at around 11:00 and began observing the vehicle in Beach Road, Mouille Point.

Officers followed the vehicle, and pulled over the occupants on Helen Suzman Boulevard, says Munro.

Two men, aged 45 and 55, from Mitchell's Plain were inside the vehicle.

On searching the men and the vehicles, housebreaking implements were found, says Munro.

"Investigation will continue to link the suspects to various housebreaking cases," Munro adds.

Heather Tager, Sea Point Community Police Forum Chairperson believes the suspects accessed properties under false pretences and then broke into empty flats within that particular building.

Tager has commended all the role-players who were involved in making this amazing breakthrough. "This once again proves that by working together fantastic results can be achieved, after all we are all working towards a safer environment," she says.

Burglaries remain a concern for the Sea Point police, Munro says. "We, as residents, must be vigilant at all times and work together proactively. All incidents should be reported to [the police] in order for them to plot the patrols."
